STEP 1 Complete the applicant section on the application form.

STEP 2 Attach copy of:

- Well Driller construction report (well log).
- Well source capacity pump test (attach pump test if capacity is not listed on well log report).
- Water Quality Test Reports: Coliform, Nitrate, and other test reports when applicable
- Well Covenants, when applicable
- Waterline & source access easements, when applicable
- Water Rights, when applicable
- Surface Water Treatment Design and Notice Regarding Use of Surface Water, when applicable
- **STEP 3** Submit the COWA form with attached documents to:
